The Town Board of the Town of Stuyvesant held their monthly business meeting on Thursday, June 14, 2012 at 7:00pm at the Town Hall. Town Clerk Melissa Naegeli was not in attendance, meeting was recorded by Catherine Knott.

Supervisor Knott called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. Supervisor Knott asked the audience to remain standing for a moment of silence in memory of Ralph Thomas, former Town Councilman who passed away recently.

A motion to approve the bills was made by Councilman Edward Scott and seconded by Councilman Thomas Burrall. The motion was passed by unanimous vote.

A motion to approve the minutes from the previous meeting was made by Councilman Edward Scott and seconded by Councilwoman Kelley Williams. The motion was passed by unanimous vote.

Correspondence

A letter of Kinderhook Memorial Library regarding a 2% increase to be included on the November ballot. The increase would result in additional \$500 for Stuyvesant.

A letter from NYMIR regarding anticipated rate decreases for 2013.

Old Business

<u>Capital Project --</u> The contracts have been signed for the highway garage renovations. Agreements are in place for modifications to the small salt shed and the concrete has been poured.

<u>Hydro Electric Plant</u> – The turbines have been installed and connected to the penstocks. The generators are on site and the concrete will be poured soon around the turbines to hold them in place.

<u>Ice House Road/Ferry Road/River Access</u> – A public presentation will be held by DEC and DOT at the Town Hall on June 20th at 6:30 to discuss plans for repairs to the crossings at the two roads. The GE Settlement money will be used to develop a public rooftop launch, pavilion and parking area for a park at the end of Ice House Raod.

REPORTS

Town Clerk/Tax Collector

Melissa Naegeli was not in attendance, the Town Clerk's report will be on file in her office. Supervisor Knott reported that the Clerk is reviewing a proposal to replace the photocopier in her office.

Assessor's Office

Cathy Knott reported that the Assessor's Office was quiet. Grievance Day was held in May and the determinations have been mailed.

ZEO/Building Inspector

Mr. Ennis' report is on file in the Town Clerk's Office.

Railroad Station Restoration Committee

Marilyn Burch reported that the Committee raised a total of \$746 from the Strawberry Festival and Bake Sale. The next event will be July 27^{th} – A Taste of Thailand.

Recreation Committee

Councilwoman Kelley Williams reported that while she was unable to attend the meeting in June, the Committee had marked out the post sites for the kiosk at Ken Hummel Memorial Park. She also announced that the basketball and tennis courts had been cleaned and thanked the volunteers who helped.

Summer Recreation Program at the Town of Kinderhook Park will be held beginning on July 9th and will run 6 weeks to August 17th. Registration forms can be obtained through the Town of Kinderhook but residents need to also register with Stuyvesant Town Clerk.

Highway Department

Superintendent Kowalski reported that work continues on the salt shed project and that work will begin soon on the highway garage renovations.

Supervisor Knott reported that he had received two reports from Wes Powell and that Mr. Powell had been busy with several dog barking complaints, lost dogs, one cruelty case and a peacock on someone's roof.

Kathy Schneider reported while she didn't attend the May meeting, the subject was hydrofracking.
